Notes: This accessibility evaluation was conducted against WCAG 2.1 Level AA and IS 17802: Accessibility Requirements for ICT Products and Services. The assessment focused on the web interface of the product and included manual testing using assistive technologies, supplemented by automated tools where applicable.

This evaluation is limited to the web application. Mobile applications, non-web software, hardware interfaces, and support services are out of scope for this report.

The product has been evaluated against GIGW web accessibility requirements; however, multilingual support—applicable primarily to government websites—has not been assessed as part of this evaluation

Evaluation Methods Used: Testing Go IndiGo Ventures Web involved extensive use of leading assistive technology, such as screen readers, screen magnifiers, and speech recognition software, as well as exclusive use of the keyboard. Native platform accessibility features were also used to assist with testing.
